I am William Bowe. I am twenty-six and my civilian occupation is that of an attorney. My educational background consisted of grammar and high school at the Latin School of Chicago, in Chicago, Illinois, where I made my home.

In 1960 I began my college studies at Yale University in New Haven, Connecticut. In 1964 I received my B.A., having majored in Political Science.

I then attended law school at the University of Chicago Law School, receiving my doctor of laws, J.D., in June 1967.

From that time until my enlistment in the United States Army I practiced law with the Chicago law firm of Messrs. Hughes, O'Keefe, Sobczak, Mc Donald & Pursons. I worked generally in the fields of corporate law, municipal law and land use controls.

I am single and have no other brothers, thirty. My mother is alive but my father is deceased.

Beginning at the end of grammar school and continuing through law school I have generally held a summer job. These jobs have varied from that of a camp counselor to that of a law clerk. One of the more
