This course :Provides a basic introduction to world-wide Communism. The major emphases are on the origin and significance of its doctrine; its general organizational concepts with a concentration on the current structure of both the open and underground Communist Parties; and the tactics employed to increase Party influence and power.

The course also :provides orientation of the USSR and Communist China: their government; economic and foreign :policy capabilities. In addition; Communist Party developments' in Latin America; Africa; Western Europe, Mid East and Southeast Asia are included.
