Although the J.A.M.I.T. award was originally intended for presentation to persons performing conspicuously noteworthy acts, the first formal presentation of the J.A.M.I.T. is hereby made to Captain Michael NMI Leonard, OF101558, for his outstanding behavior during his tenure at the Counter-intelligence Analysis Branch. During the period January 1968 until he volunteered for service in Vietnam, his actions were characterized by a cheerful "can do" attitude. He continuously and unbegrudgingly volunteered his services above and beyond the call of duty. His constant recognition of the high responsibilities of his office and his devotion to duty in safeguarding the national security interests served to inspire those who have known and grown to love him.

Captain Leonard's selfless dedication to duty was exemplified by his request, and concurrence thereof, for an 18-month extension and voluntary return to Vietnam in order to personally combat and crush creeping godless communism.

However, upon receipt of his change of assignment, Captain Leonard exhibited a reluctance to depart his colleagues, a reluctance seldom displayed in the annals of military history.

During this period, because of his lackadaisical and indifferent approach, his position rapidly deteriorated to utter shambles.
