

SGT William Bowe, 328-34-0398, assigned to the Counterintelligence Analysis Detachment (CIAD), Office of the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence (OACSI), from _____ to May 1971, performed his duties as a counter-intelligence analyst with outstanding proficiency. While serving in his capacity, SGT Bowe was thoroughly knowledgeable of a wide spectrum of organizations and personalities involved in domestic, subversive, and racial civil disturbance activities and the threat posed by these organizations against the security of the nation and the US Army. SGT Bowe attacked his job with enthusiasm, pleased to be given the opportunity to attack the "Godless Communist Slavemasters" and to watch those civilians (and I might add, politicians) who didn't strictly adhere to administration policy. With a great deal of initiative, SGT Bowe singlehandedly instituted a surveillance plan (ref: Routing Slip, 21 Jan 69) to watch those which were felt to stray a little left of center. He specialized in the identification and analysis of anti-war left-wing elements, such as the John Birch Society, and produced extensive analytical material and estimates on these subjects for use in various bureaucratic boomboggles and repressive measures designed to stifle the expression of any beliefs counter to those expressed by Vice-President Agnew. SGT Bowe deserves special recognition in that his work was immediate utilitarian value to the US Army, local police forces and innumerable credit bureaus. His exceptional competence in the performance of his duties has contributed to the Domestic spying mission of the Army and reflects great credit upon himself, his unit, and the United States Army.
